

A Shared Commitment to Protect the Environment and Biodiversity

Agincourt Resources' commitment to environmental management and biodiversity conservation is driven by a clear objective: to create a sustainable mining operation. This commitment is reflected in the various initiatives and ongoing programs we continuously implement, including:

- Planting 90,000 mangrove seedlings and releasing 70,000 juvenile shellfish and crabs across 29 hectares of coastal area in Central Tapanuli, contributing to coastal ecosystem restoration and strengthening local marine habitats.
- Revegetation and land reclamation programs aimed at restoring forest functions and rehabilitating previously disturbed land, supporting long-term ecological balance.
- Installation of a 2.1 MWp solar photovoltaic (PV) system at the Martabe Gold Mine, utilizing 42 on-grid rooftop systems. The solar PV is installed across 98 buildings located in three operational zones: Highland Area, Lowland Area, and the Residential (Mess) Area, supporting the Company's transition toward cleaner energy.
- Biodiversity conservation initiatives, including support for Lubuk Larangan (community-based river conservation areas) and sea turtle hatchling releases along the West Coast of Muara Opu, Muara Batang Toru District, reinforcing ecosystem protection and community engagement in conservation efforts.

- Enhancing rehabilitation effectiveness through intensive identification of native plant species, expansion of nursery capacity, and the implementation of mycorrhizal symbiotic techniques under the supervision of IPB University.
- Consistently conducting feasibility assessments of process water discharge and transparently sharing independent laboratory test results with local communities.
- Preventing pollution through tree-planting initiatives, the implementation of 3R practices (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle), and the operation of a Waste Sortation Facility (WSF).
- Ensuring the safe management and placement of tailings and process residual rock.
- Protecting wildlife through the establishment of a Biodiversity Advisory Panel comprising Indonesian scientists with expertise in forest ecosystems and orangutan conservation.

The Martabe Gold Mine operates under a sixth-generation 30-year Contract of Work with the Government of Indonesia. The concession area covers 130,252 hectares (1,303 km²) across the regencies of South Tapanuli, Central Tapanuli, North Tapanuli, and Mandailing Natal in North Sumatra.

As of December 2024, the active operational area of the Martabe Gold Mine in South Tapanuli Regency spans 646 hectares.
